### Construction Law Update

This session will provide a comprehensive update on the recent Construction Act amendments, including contract administration issues such as the new requirement for annual holdback release and changes to prompt payment requirements, as well as changes relevant to how disputes are managed including notice requirements for contract termination and key changes to the adjudication regime.

The panel will also explore the interplay between ODACC and CanDACC, including whether ODACC is available to subcontractors on federal projects and the practical impact on general contractors caused by subcontractors being able to bring a wide range of claims to ODACC while payment disputes can only be adjudicated at CanDACC.


